Summary

For this “mini” writing project, you will reflect on what you’ve learned in the class and how you might use it in the future.

Basic Requirements

The final draft needs to be a minimum of **500 words**

Due Dates

- **Final drafts** of the Reflection Task are due on **Tuesday, December 8th (by 11:59 pm)**

Learning Objectives

The purpose of the Reflection Task is to:

- Think critically about what we have learned this semester.
- Consider how knowledge from this class might be used in other contexts.
- Encourage reflection on writing to help build knowledge.
- Encourage learning transfer through reflection.

Final Draft Basics

You will only be required to turn in one draft of your reflection task. These will be graded on the following:

- **Reflection** on a minimum of **three things** you learned this semester.
- **Explanation** of how each of these things learned might be used in a future context (in school or out of school).
- **Effort** to take the assignment seriously and reflect deeply on what you’ve learned.

Grading for the reflection task is relatively easy: If you complete the task according to the guidelines, you will receive 100%. If you do not complete it, do not meet the guidelines, or do not take the assignment seriously, you will lose points accordingly.

Please submit your first draft in Google Drive and share it with me. Your file should be named with your name, your class (including days and time), and the assignment (i.e. Malcolm Reynolds ENG 1510 TTh 9 am Reflection Task).
