### **WP0: What I Know about Writing**

### **Description**

There are three purposes of WP0, but the most important one is to get us ready to reflect critically on writing. Through this project, we want you to see what you know already and what you can build on. In addition, this project helps you get used to the Writing Project format you'll use for the remaining writing projects and helps you set up the portfolio.

#### **Learning Outcomes**

By the end of this writing project, you will be able to:

- Articulate what you already know about writing.
- Identify areas for improvement.
- Set up a writing project in your portfolio.

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WP0 will focus on experiences you've had with writing, what you've learned from them, and what you still hope to learn. If you were to teach a less experienced writer about writing, what would you teach them? Why is this important? If you were to learn from a more

experienced writer, what would you ask them to help you with?

WP0 should be *roughly* 300-500 words in length.

then be adapted into your portfolio during class time. Please post

your submission in advance to get full credit.

WP0 is due on Friday, August 30. We will put your draft into your

portfolio on that day during class time.
