

### **Purpose**

Now that your group has submitted a research proposal and is collecting sources for your research paper, you will prepare an annotated bibliography to be shared online—a “webography.” An annotated bibliography is a reference page in APA format that includes an annotation summarizing each source and assessing that source’s relevance to your research. You will also rate each source according to agreed upon criteria, which you will be sharing.

### **Organization and Development**

Your group annotated bibliography will consist of at least 12-16 sources. Your collective research should present your audience with a clear overview of your topic and should cover all of the major voices and viewpoints.

#### **Individual Contributions:**

Each of you must contribute 4 useful, evaluated sources to your group submission. Each webography entry will include:

- Full proper APA citation
- Objective summary of the source
- Rubric-evaluation of the source
- Brief discussion of the ways in which the source might inform your research (very credible sources might be used to substantiate major arguments whereas less credible sources might be used to represent a particular viewpoint or anecdotally).
- Your name

#### **Group contributions:**

Your group will organize all the individual pages together into a collection, perhaps using Word Online, perhaps using something like Google Sites. This collection will include:

- An introduction to the topic
- Each source page from each person
- A concluding section that discusses how your sources will be useful for your project
- Your criteria and a brief discussion thereof in an appendix

### **Audience**

Although your group will use your annotated bibliography as an aid in your research presentation, also consider it as a resource for others to read if they are interested in researching the same topic.

### **Evaluation**

Your webography is a group project worth 150 points. Of those, 120 points will be based on your individual contributions and 30 will be based on the collaborative components.
