### Course Requirements

Your grade for this class will be based on 5 items:

- Final Debates (35 points)
- Group Teaching Demonstration (25 points)
- Individual Interviews (10 points)
- Class Participation and Attendance (20 points)
- Pop Quizzes Over Reading Material (10 points)

### Grading

Final grades will be curved to meet departmental grading standards. If final grades to not fall into the following range, grades will be adjusted:

- No more than 30% of students will receive an A or higher.
- No more than 70% of students will receive a B or higher.

This, of course, means that 30% of students in this course will receive a C+ or lower. Please do not ask for me to give you a higher grade after the semester is over unless you think that I made a mistake. I do not generally change grades.

## Attendance and Class Participation

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Each class period is worth 1 point. You can lose this point in several ways:

- If you do not attend class, you lose 1 point.
- If you are late to class, you will lose 0.2 points for every 10 minutes that you are late up to 1 point.
- If you do not participate in classroom activities, such as actively talking during conversations, using excessive Korean during class, not answering questions, or anything similar, you will lose 1 point.

If you have a valid reason for not attending class (such as a medical problem or job interview, please let me know in advance if possible. Bring proof of the reason for your absence to the next class that you attend.

## Cheating

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You are expected to do all of your own work during class time. Cheating will result in failure of that assignment. Cheating includes (but is not limited to):

- Copying any part of any of your presentations from the internet, a book, or another person. All presentation materials must be made by yourself.
- Copying from another student during quizzes.
- Basically, presenting any material that you did not make as your own.

I take cheating very seriously. If you aren't sure if something is cheating or not, ask me.
