Connection Project



Although we have covered a wide range of topics in the class, there are also many more that we could have covered. The Connection Project is an opportunity to bring in some of those additional topics to explore and discuss.

For this project, you will find a text you're interested in discussing with the class and create a multimodal project summarizing, analyzing, and connecting the text to class content. You have two options for the type of text that you'll explore:

- Option 1 is to find a scholarly webtext from a journal in English or a related field. Possible journals include *Kairos*, *Enculturation*, *Computers and Composition Online*, *Fibreculture*, *Vectors*, and the *Journal of Multimodal Rhetorics* (among others). If you choose this option, you will analyze this text, breaking down the creator's argument, the rhetorical moves they make across various media, and the design choices they've made.
- Option 2 is to find a scholarly text (digital or traditional) that connects your own areas of scholarly interest to classroom content. You can think of this as a text that is about "new media and..." For example, some areas left out of classroom discussion have been L2 writing, WPA work, universal design, and online teaching, and some areas under-represented include video game studies, feminist theory, user experience, and copyright. All of these topics have bodies of literature that connect with new media. If you choose this option, you will summarize the text and connect it to other class content.

In both cases, you will create a multimodal text (hypertext, audio, video, or other agreed-upon medium) presenting your project to the class. This text should be concise and focused, taking no more than 5 minutes to consume regardless of form.

Objectives

- To bring in additional topics for class discussion.
- To consider rhetorical and design moves scholars use to make arguments.
- To connect class topics to your research interests.
- To practice making multimodal texts.

Requirements

- Projects must take no more than 5 minutes to consume.
- Projects must include examples from the text, such as quotes or screen captures.
- Projects must be posted (semi-) publicly for your classmates to consume.

Due Date

- First drafts are due Monday, October 29th
- Connection Projects are due Wednesday, October 31st

Additional Requirements and Tips

- Texts for your Connection Project will be “called” in a discussion post in Schoology. No two students can choose the same text.
- Connection Projects should be posted in two locations:
 - A link to your Connection Project should be posted in the appropriate discussion board in Schoology for your peers to consume.
 - A link should be included in a document in Google Drive for me to leave comments on. Please create the document in your class folder in Drive and name it with your name, the class name, and the name of the assignment (e.g. “Malcolm Reynolds ENG 7970 Connection Project”).

Grading

The grading criteria will be slightly different depending on whether you choose to analyze a webtext or connect to your own research.

Grading Criteria for Webtext Analysis

Your grade for the either option will be determined by how well you meet the criteria for that option.

- A You exceed the expectations for five or more of the criteria. All others are met.
- A- You exceed the expectations for two to four of the criteria. All others are met.
- B+ You meet the expectations for all of the criteria.
- B You do not meet the expectations for one of the criteria. All others are met.
- B- You do not meet the expectations for two of the criteria. All others are met.
