### Reflection



The Reflection is the final project of the semester, and it serves as a way to consider what you've learned and how it might connect to content outside of the class. This is a low-stakes assignment designed to promote metacognition about learning. For the reflection, please consider at least three things you learned from the class and project them into a context outside of the class where you might use what you learned: in future classes, in research, in teaching, or in your personal life.

### Additional Requirements and Tips

- You are encouraged, but not required, to include outside media, such as screen captures or clips from previous assignments.
- Please create a document for your reflection in your class folder in Google Drive. If your Reflection is a multimodal text, you can put a link to it in that document. Please name the document with your name, the class, and the assignment (e.g. "Malcolm Reynolds ENG 7970 Reflection").

### Objectives

- To promote learning transfer through reflection.
- To connect class content to outer contexts.

### Requirements

- Reflections must be 1000 words or the multimodal equivalent.
- Reflections must include three or more things learned.
- Reflections must connect all things learned to a context outside the class.

- Reflections are due Monday, December 10<sup>th</sup> by 11:59 PM

### Grading

The following criteria will be used to determine grades for the Reflection:

Expectations	Exceeded	Met	Not Met
Explanation	You explain more than three things you learned and use specific examples that help to clarify what you learned.	You explain at least three things that you learned. You use examples from the class.	You do not explain at least three things that you learned or do not use examples.
Projection	For all examples, you connect to a very specific future context in which what you learned will be used. You explain how that knowledge will be used in that context.	For all examples, you connect to a future context in which you will use what you learned. You explain how you will use that knowledge.	You do not connect to a future context or do not explain how you will use what you learned in that context for one or more of your examples.
Attention to Assignment	You meet the 1000-word requirement and use outside media.	You meet or nearly meet the 1000-word requirement.	You fall well short of the 1000-word requirement.

Your grade for the Reflection will be determined by how well you meet the above criteria.

- A You exceed the expectations for two or more of the criteria. All others are met.
- A- You exceed the expectations for one of the criteria. All others are met.
- B+ You meet the expectations for all of the criteria.
- B You do not meet the expectations for one of the criteria. All others are met.
- B- You do not meet the expectations for two of the criteria. All others are met.
