Learning Objectives

- To reflect on class content and applications beyond the class.
- To help to get learning from the class to be accessible in other situations.
- To begin to explore ways that learning from the class can continue in other situations.

Basics

The basics are the minimum requirements for the Class Reflection.

- Reflect on a minimum of three things you think you have learned this semester. Consider what you have learned from Final Project, Digital Literacy Narrative, Concept Video, Journals, readings, and class activities.
- Explain specifically what you have learned. In particular, try to consider what you can do now that you could not in January.
- Project your learning to future contexts. Try to think of how you might use this knowledge in other classes, outside of school, or in your future career.
- While the reflection can take whatever form you'd like, I encourage you to use skills that you learned this semester, such as video production, audio production, and any skills learned as part of the Final Project.
- Submit your reflection in the Google Drive folder for this class. Your files should be named with your name, your class, and the assignment (i.e. Malcolm Reynolds ENG 3860 Class Reflection).

Grading

The Class Reflection will be graded on the following:

- **Explanation:** You explain what you have learned in this class. You are detailed and specific.
- **Application:** You have applied what you've learned to a future situation or situations. You are detailed and specific. Each thing that you've learned has at least one future application.
- **Media Use:** You use media in the creation of your reflection. Any media not created by you is used ethically and cited appropriately.
- **Effort:** You have taken the assignment seriously and attempted to make real connections across contexts.

Grading

- A: You exceed expectations for the assignment. You have met all criteria and gone beyond.
- B: You meet all expectations for the assignment.
- C: You have minor problems meeting some or all expectations for the criteria.
- D: You have major problems meeting some or all expectations for the criteria.
- F: You do not meet the minimum expectations for the assignment.
